An eponym is a word that originated from the name of a specific person, place, or thing but 26 a much broader, general meaning over time. One of the classic examples of an eponym derived from a person's name 27 "paparazzi." This term dates back to a photographer 28 Paparazzo in the Italian film *La Dolce Vita*. The photographer works with a writer to 29 the private lives of celebrities. Following the movie's 30, the character's name stuck in the public consciousness, and its plural form, *paparazzi*, quickly became the term used to describe all photographers who chase celebrities around.

On the other hand, product-based eponyms occur when a specific brand name becomes so common that it is used to describe other similar products or an action. Photoshop is an 31 software program created by Adobe Inc. It is used to modify and digitally combine images and photographs. Since its release in 1987, Photoshop has become the standard software used by designers around the world. It became so popular that people began to use "Photoshop" as a verb to mean "to edit a photo." 32, Adobe resisted this trend to protect its trademark, and yet the eponym has become too popular for people to stop its widespread usage.

Unlike most trees that are badly damaged by lightning, the almendro tree in Panama is an exception. In a study of 93 lightning-struck trees from various species, researchers discovered that most of them died within two years. 33, all nine almendro trees survived. In 2025, a slang term emerged in American youth culture that left adults completely **baffled**: "67" (pronounced "six seven"). Originating from rapper Skrilla's song *Doot Doot* (67), the term honored 67th Street in Philadelphia where he grew up. It came with a specific gesture involving both palms facing up, moving alternately up and down. The catchy chorus quickly went viral on TikTok. Fans even linked the trend to NBA star LaMelo Ball, who is 6 feet 7 inches tall. However, the meme truly took off when a student nicknamed the "67 Kid" flashed the hand signs and shouted "SIX SEVEN!" at a school basketball game. This video triggered widespread imitation among teenagers nationwide. Google even added a hidden Easter egg to its search engine. If you type "67" into Google, the entire webpage will start shaking violently.

The well-known online dictionary *Dictionary.com* described "67" as a classic example of "Brain-Rot slang." Its primary characteristics are that it is completely meaningless and ridiculous. It is an inside joke that only the younger generation understands, specifically when adults are left completely clueless.

While adults might view this "brain-rot" slang as pure nonsense, there is a science behind its popularity. First, the trend is heavily influenced by the "fear of missing out". In school, no one wants to be the only person who doesn't get the joke. When everyone around is making the hand gesture, joining in becomes a quick way to feel included. Second, when teenagers make the hand gesture, their brains instantly link back to the fun, relaxed feeling of scrolling through social media. Finally, the trend acts as an inside joke that makes teenagers feel like they are in charge. By playfully inviting confused adults to try the gesture, teens flip the usual roles. They become the masters of their digital culture, turning a meaningless slang into an everyday laugh.

Sleep is a fundamental natural process that is essential for the recovery of both the mind and the body. The position you choose to sleep in is very important for getting the most out of these benefits. Most people use one of several common positions, each of which has its own pros and cons.

(A) Supine Position Sleeping on your back is often considered one of the healthiest choices. It helps reduce pressure on the joints and supports proper spinal alignment, which is helpful for people with neck or lower back pain. However, this position can make snoring and sleep apnea worse. This happens because gravity causes the tongue and throat tissues to drop backward, partially blocking the airway. Therefore, back sleeping might not be best for people with breathing difficulties.
(B) Prone Position Generally, sleeping on your stomach is thought to offer the least amount of support for the body. While it might help some people snore less by keeping their airways open, this small benefit is often outweighed by problems. This position forces the neck to stay twisted to one side for many hours, which puts stress on the spine and leads to back pain and muscle tension. Additionally, the weight and pressure on the chest can make it harder to breathe deeply.
Lateral Position Research shows that most people prefer to sleep on their side. This position promotes better spinal health and is linked to less snoring than sleeping on the back or stomach. However, the specific side you choose—left or right—can change the effect on your health: • (C) Left-Side Sleeping: This is often recommended because it reduces acid reflux (heartburn). Since the stomach is located on the left side of the body, gravity helps keep stomach acid down. This position also helps the kidneys and lymphatic drainage, the body’s waste-clearing system, work better. It is especially helpful for pregnant women, as it improves blood flow to the baby and reduces swelling in the legs and feet. • (D) Right-Side Sleeping: This might be more comfortable for people with certain heart conditions, as it puts less physical stress on the heart. Many people also find it simply feels more natural. However, sleeping on the right side is more likely to cause heartburn.
